This booklet details the many reasons why what was to become Canada and other British Colonies needed to rely on tokens for local commerce. The British coins were needed in Britain and the tokens were overvalued in the colonies to keep them there. The colonists supplied raw materials to Britain and were discouraged from purchasing finished goods from anywhere else. 22 pages.

A SURVEY REPORT ON THE RARITY OF ORIGINAL GEM PRE-1937 DECIMAL COINAGE OF CANADA, NEWFOUNDLAND AND THE OTHER MARITIME PROVINCES. BRIAN CORNWELL. 1982.

This booklet details the availability/unavailability of gem Canadian coins dated before 1937. Any coins showing hairlines or signs of improper handling or cleaning were excluded. The survey was returned from 24 experts in the field. The results are shown in both chart and graph format. This may be a copy since the pages are stapled together but it is still a valuable reference to the scarcity of gem coinage at the time. 20 pages.

SILVER AND NICKEL DOLLARS OF CANADA, 1911 TO DATE. STEPHAN E. DUSHNICK. 1978.

Comprehensive guide to each silver and nickel dollar struck from 1911 to 1978 with a section showing the processes involved in minting these coins. Varieties are detailed. There is a section on the artists involved in designing the coins and a grading guide. There is damage to the dust jacket. 171 pages.

A HISTORY OF THE CANADIAN DOLLAR. BANK OF CANADA. 1999.

A detailed history of the dollar from the differences in the Halifax valuation of a Spanish dollar compared to a York valuation through early paper currencies to the modern loonie. Their black covers are very recognizable.

CONFEDERATE STATES PAPER MONEY (Centennial Edition!) – ARLIE R. SLABAUGH

This book covers Confederate notes from the Montgomery Issue in 1861 until the seventh issue on February 17, 1864. The notes were meant to be more of a bond with the plantation owners. A portion of their cotton produced was ‘sold’ to the South with the intention that after the South won the war, the notes could be redeemed with a healthy interest. Unfortunately, that did not happen. Ironically, many of the notes were printed in New York! The book was printed in 1961, has 64 pages and was donated by Tom Masters.

56

GUIDE BOOK OF U.S. FRACTIONAL CURRENCY – MATT ROTHERT

This book covers fractional currency from 1862 to 1876. There was about 369 million dollars of these notes printed and it is estimated that there is only about one half of one percent of this amount still outstanding. The book was printed in 1963, has 81 pages and was donated by Fred Jewett.
